## How Do I Know If I'm A Candidate for Bariatric Surgery?

#### Determine if you meet BMI Criteria

- BMI (body mass index) is a calculation between a person's weight and height.
- Use the BMI calculator found on our webpage to determine your personal BMI
- To qualify for bariatric surgery:
  - BMI 35 or greater with
    2 co –morbidities
    For example: Diabetes,
    Hypertension
  - BMI 40 or greater

Classification	BMI Category (kg/m²)	Risk of developing health problems
Underweight	< 18.5	Increased
Normal Weight	18.5 - 24.9	Least
Overweight	25.0 - 29.9	Increased
Obese class I	30.0 - 34.9	High
Obese class	35.0 - 39.9	Very high
Obese class	>= 40.0	Extremely high

- We perform six laparoscopic/robotic bariatric procedures:
  - BilioPancreatic Diversion with Duodenal Switch
  - Gastric Bypass (Roux-en-Y)
  - Vertical Sleeve Gastrectomy (VSG)
  - Adjustable Gastric Band
  - Endoscopic Revision Procedure
  - Laparoscopic Revisional Surgery

- Our Surgical Coordinators will contact you if you do not have the benefits and offer self pay pricing prior to your appointment

Obtain REFERRALS for all visits if your plan requires them. If you are not sure, contact your insurer via the 800# on the back of your insurance card.

#### **Surgical Process for Bariatric Surgery from start to finish**

- Meet your surgeon
  - o talk about all types of surgeries and answer any and all questions
- Meet with Surgical Coordinator
  - o go over all requirements for surgery and schedule Wellness Appointments
- Wellness Appointments
  - this starts your "clock" with your insurance company
- Endoscopy Procedure
- Monthly Nutrition Classes
  - during this time you will be given orders for required testing prior to scheduling surgery (you want to finish all of these by the time you finish your classes)
- If required, recap with your surgeon
- Nutrition Class Completion Letter
- Schedule surgery
  - o this will only happen if you have completed your classes, completed all required testing and have a CPAP machine if you are required to have one
  - If you have any FMLA paperwork, please submit it at this point. There is a \$30 per FMLA form
- 2nd visit with Surgeon and Dietitian
- Surgical clearance with PCP and any other specialists if needed
- Final visit with surgeon and Dietitian just prior to surgery
- Surgery
- 2 week post op

Please note that you will have multiple appointments during your first year post op. They are as follows:

- 2 week post op
- 6 week post op
- 3 month post op
- 6 month post op
- 9 month post op
- 1 year post op

It is very important to go to all of these appointments as your first year is the most crucial for care
